This ministry for those in need is open Mondays and Thursdays from 10:00 AM to noon. Every week throughout the year. We give out up to 170 bags of food each month. Every Thanksgiving we give 100 thanksgiving baskets to families. We spend between \$1600 and \$2000 for food for the pantry every two months. Food is purchased at the Toledo Seagate Food Bank. In addition to this 150 pounds of chicken is purchased each week.

## Rosary Cathedral Women

The women of the parish have a friendly get-together with prayer, inspiration, friendship and refreshments several times each year. Rosary Cathedral Women gathered for our first meeting last December on a Sunday afternoon and focused on an Advent theme. We met again in April and at a parishioner's home in July. This coming year we plan to reach out to the mothers of the Rosary Cathedral School children and invite them as our guests. We also have plans for a gathering during Advent and the Easter season. Women of all ages are welcome. Planning is kept simple with the hope to foster community among us as we seek to live out our parish vision.

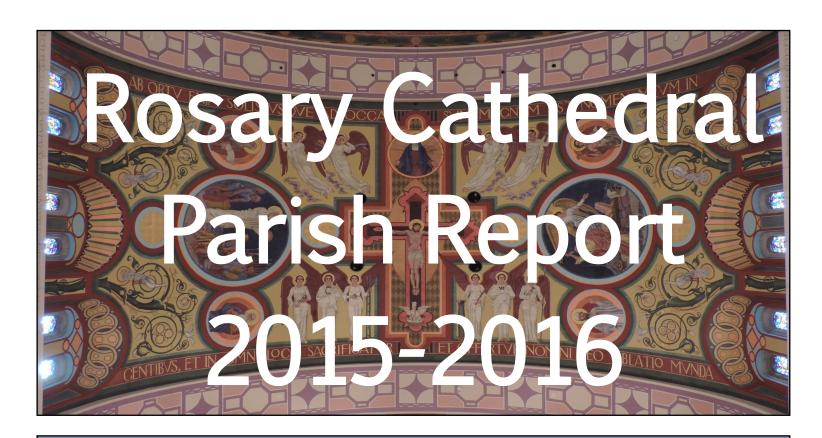
## Cathedral Ceiling Bible Study
